



2019 Event Host Guidelines - Target

The ABAM Target Event Host Guidelines have been developed to assist Clubs to understand what is expected by hosting an ABAM sanctioned event. The guidelines clarify registration timelines, event formats, and to help with planning and organizing.

ABAM provides services to:

- Schedule events on the Provincial Events Calendar
- Register events with Archery Canada & World Archery
- Coordinate the assignment of a judge(s) (ratio of 1 judge to 15 Archers)
- Provide Scorecards
- Submit results to Archery Canada and publish results on the ABAM website
- Providing some tournament equipment, such as target butts and stands, timers and displays as available

Registration

Event Registration Deadlines:

Registered events must be open to all ABAM, Archery Canada and World Archery members.

Late Registration – *Any event registered after the designated event registration deadline as stated above.*

Requests for late registration must be submitted at least 15 business days before the planned event date. All late registrations will be subject to a \$30 Fee.

All events must be registered using the “2019 ABAM Target Event – Club Registration” online registration form.

Officiating

All ABAM registered events must follow Archery Canada rules. All ABAM registered events must

be officiated by a certified Provincial Judge. ABAM will appoint and approve Judges for all registered events. Clubs may identify Judges available for ABAM registered events. The required provincial judge to athlete ratio is 1:15.

Funding Support

- ABAM will fund Archery Canada Registration (\$30 per event) for a maximum four (4) events per season (Indoor/Outdoor)
- ABAM will fund one (1) Provincial Judge Expenses (\$38.50 + Mileage*) for a maximum four (4) events per season (Indoor/Outdoor).
- ABAM will fund additional Archery Canada Registration & Judge Expenses to any club that hosts a Provincial Championship.

Additional Event Registration

- Any shoots registered beyond the maximum four (4) eligible for funding support per season, will be responsible to pay ABAM the following rates for event registration and officials expenses:

Indoor Target Season

- Archery Canada (AC) Indoor Rounds - \$30.00
- World Archery (WA) Indoor Rounds - \$50.00 (Includes AC registration)

Outdoor Season

- Archery Canada Outdoor Rounds - \$30.00
- World Archery Outdoor Rounds - \$50.00 (Includes AC registration)

Officials Expenses (Indoor & Outdoor)

- ABAM Officials Honorarium - \$38.50 per judge (may be subject to change)
- Judge Mileage - \$0.35/KM for any distance over 100 KM round trip.

Recommended Event Participation Fees

A \$5.00 discount of event fees, at any ABAM sanctioned event, must be offered to all participants who are current members of the ABAM in good standing.

It is recommended that minimum athlete registration fees for indoor events be:

- \$30.00 for Senior, and Master age class
- \$25.00 for Junior, and Cadet age class
- \$20.00 for Cub and Pre-cub age class
- \$15.00 for Peewee age class

It is recommended that minimum athlete registration fees for outdoor events be:

- \$25.00 for Senior, and Master age class
- \$20.00 for Junior, and Cadet age class

- \$15.00 for Cub and Pre-cub age class
- \$10.00 for Peewee age class

Results

All results must be submitted to ABAM in the form of physical scorecards by drop off/mail, or scanned scorecards or scoring summary by email to info@abam.ca within 15 business days of the event. ABAM will ensure they are submitted to Archery Canada and World Archery as required. Clubs that submit electronically are responsible for the retention of original scorecards for up to 14 months following the event date. Note: All non-members scores will not be submitted to Archery Canada.

Proper Scoring Protocol

Arrow values are the responsibility of the archer who has been designated as the caller. This individual must call each arrow as they lay and provide a distinct value for each arrow. An arrow shall be scored according to the position of the shaft in the target face. All other archers within the scoring group are to confirm they agree with the values, any disputes please ask a judge who makes the final decision.

All arrow holes in the scoring zone shall be suitably marked by the athletes every time the arrows are scored and drawn from the target face.

Each scorer is responsible for completing the end total as well as the cumulative totals independently of each other. After each of you have completed the archers total you are to compare not only the totals but also the arrow values. Any mistakes that are made are to be corrected before pulling the arrows which requires the initials of all parties involved.

Athletes are responsible for submitting requests for record score recognition. ABAM will assist as needed with such submissions.

Two or more clubs will be not be permitted to host target events on the same date. In the event that two clubs within 100 KM choose the same date, if both clubs agree they may share the date, it will be permitted. If the clubs cannot agree, the club whom first submitted their request, as determined by the online registration timestamp, will be awarded the date.

In the case that a registered event has to be rescheduled, due to events beyond the clubs control, late spring thaw, natural disaster, etc., and by request of the affected club, the executive committee, on its discretion, may award another unrequested date, or if no unrequested dates are available the executive committee may allow the event to take place on the same date as another event.

No other event will be sanctioned on the same weekend as a Provincial Championship event or National Championship event held within the province of Manitoba.
