



## Instructor of Intermediate Archers workshops

The **Instructor of Intermediate Archers** training is a National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) that deals with your development as an Instructor delivering advanced archery skills to intermediate archers.

Content of the course includes topics such as:

- technical archery topics
- equipment and training
  - facilities
  - equipment
  - analysing performance
- teaching and learning
- athletes and self esteem
- case studies
- designing a sport program
  - basic sport program
  - athlete development
  - athletic abilities
  - training priorities and practice

### Participants

Participants should be archers with advanced abilities and at least four years experience who are interested in instructing in the context of intermediate archers of all ages. Prior experience instructing archers is normally expected but not required.

### Other Requirements

Candidates must have training in

- Making Ethical Decisions
- Planning a Practice

These are available through NCCP Part A training (available 17,18 September) OR Instructor of Beginner Archers workshop training.

### Certification

Successful candidates will be certified as NCCP Instructor of Intermediate Archers.

### Training and Evaluation

The training workshops involves about 15 hours of instruction and cooperative exercises presented over two weekends. This is followed by completion of workbook and portfolio assignments. Evaluation of candidates is in the form of presentations during the workshops, evaluation of workbook and portfolio assignments following the workshop, and on-site evaluation working with your archers arranged with the instructor
