We are lucky to have a talented group of archers at every level; lessons, club level, target archery, our mobile archery program, Fort Whyte, 3D archery, pole archery, and a provincial team of individuals working hard to showcase their abilities locally, nationally and internationally.

Some of these international successes include; Austin (National Compound Team, World Indoors Bronze Team Medal, Vegas 3rd place , Salt Lake World Cup) Bryanne (National Compound Team, World Indoors Silver Medal Team Round, Salt Lake World Cup, Pan American Championships in Colombia, winning first female compound quota spot to Pan American Games (Lima, Peru 2019)

One of the highlights this year was that we hosted the Manitoba Games in Thompson in 2018 for the first time since it was held in Carmen Manitoba in 2008. This offered introduction to indoor 18M format, injection of new volunteer coaches, managers and competitive athletes. This provided a wonderful development opportunity for our judges and event organizers. The event met its goal of filling competitive teams in all gender and equipment categories. The city of Thompson was fantastic and hosted one of the most successful games to date. Thank you to all involved!

We are excited and looking forward to the upcoming Canada Winter Games in 2019 being held in Red Deer. Our coach Duncan and team manager Avril, have been working hard to prepare the athletes. We have a great looking group of archers nearing the end of selection period. Manitoba has great potential heading to the Games. Ryan will be going as Sport MB Mission Staff, and Mike will be going as a national official.

Over the course of the year, Manitoba board members have attended meetings with Archery Canada in person and teleconferences working with the other provinces to share and collaborate ideas. It is nice to hear that many of the provinces look to Manitoba to see how we are running our programs and having such success.

I would also like to recognize and thank our funding partner; Sport Manitoba. They provide our organization with invaluable resources and guidance. The upcoming 2018 – 2024 IFF planning is on track to continue to provide our organization with support moving forward. They are pleased with how we are running things, stating that "Archery continues to do a great job, specific to organizational management & athlete development".

Both Judges will be officiating at the 2018 Canadian Archery Championships
- Provincial Coach Coordinator Ron Cooney had a successful year taking over the role from Roger Garrod. Ron has been training toward his Master Coach Developer status, while leading his first Instructor Beginner Archer Course this spring.
- The Province has a healthy pool of developing coaches and officials to ensure the sport can grow in Manitoba.

Anticipated Challenges in 2018-2019

- Competition Development Certified Coaches – While the organization has made creating a pool of Comp. Dev. Certified Coaches a priority, Manitoba currently has a very small list of active provincial high-performance coaches. This will continue to be a priority and a challenge.
- Performance Pathway – Though there are a variety of programs and events for people learning to shoot, we have challenges transitioning participants to the club competitions. This challenge exists for both Target & 3D Archery in Manitoba.
- Sport Development Information – Without a nationally driven Learn to Shoot Program, Manitoba has a variety of Learn to Shoot Programs driven by clubs and ranges. Due to a lack of consistency in the programming curriculums, not all participants are aware of what the sport has to offer at the next stages of Long Term Athlete Development.

VP COACHES & OFFICIALS REPORT

Officials Development

Manitoba currently has 7 active judges with Provincial level certification or higher. Out of those 7 judges we now have 2 judges with National certification and another judge in their 2 year as a National Candidate (with 1 year remaining). We also have four individuals who are currently working towards obtaining local judge certification, with anticipation of a higher certification. During 2018 we have seen over 91 events held within the province of Manitoba (Winnipeg, Birtle, Giourx, Thompson, Selkirk, Sanford, St George and Neepawa) which required a judge to be present, this includes 3D/target indoor and outdoor events. Our judges do not just stay within the province of Manitoba as we saw one of our judges attend the 3D Indoor Nationals which was hosted by town of Sundre, Alberta during the spring of 2018. Canada Cup (Prince Albert) and Alberta Summer Classic (Sherwood Park) also saw not only our judges but our local judge candidates participate in officiating their events. The 2018 Canadian Outdoor National Championships saw 2 judges from Manitoba as part of the judging team, with one attending all three of the Championships and another just for the Field and Target. Manitoba also has a judge who sits on the Archery Canada Judging Committee for a 2-year term.

The Manitoba Games held in Thompson in the spring of 2018 was a great event not only for the development of our judges but also provided developmental aspects as organizing and planning of bigger events. This saw a crew of about 9 individuals from an organizing perspective go up to Thompson for 6 days to run a very successful event. Thanks to the city of Thompson, Manitoba Hydro and Sport Manitoba for the opportunity in assisting of the development of not only of our officials but also for our coach development within the province of Manitoba.

Coach Development

The Manitoba Games in Thompson was a great opportunity in developing coaches within the province. In the months leading up to the games 5 coaches and 5 managers participated in numerous seminars to increase their level of coaching experience. This is setting up Manitoba in developing coaches at different levels of certification going forward. Ron Cooney has taken on the role of certifying coaches within the province, in order to do this Ron has travelled to other provinces and is putting in countless hours in order to obtain his certification. A beginner coaching clinic was facilitated by Ron in the summer which included numerous club level coaches and athletes. Before the end of 2018, ABAM will be partnering with Archery Canada & National Learning Facilitator Duncan Crawford to host an NCCP Competition Development Coaching Clinic, followed by a weekend long high performance coach training session led by Duncan Crawford, Archery Canada High Performance Consultant Alan Brahmst and National Recurve Head Coach Shawn Riggs. This final training opportunity will sum up a year of quality coach development at all levels.

Athlete Development Committee

Manitoba Games took place in Thompson March 4-10. In lead up to the games each region put on some training camps to prepare for the games. Archery was part of week one and was a huge success. All the athletes did amazing, with all 5 regions receiving medals.

Winnipeg Gold – 4 medals

Winnipeg Blue – 6 medals

East – 4 medals

South – 1 medal

West – 3 medals

There were four new athletes that were named to the Provincial Target Team this year, Brandon Peterson – senior compound, Chyler Sanders -cub compound, Hailee MacDonald – cub recurve and Sloane Scrivener – cub compound.

The 2018 Canadian Archery Championships in Truro, NS August 8-12th was a success. We had 14 Manitobans participate, out of the 14. 11 were our Provincial Target Team members. Team Manitoba made the Podium 9 times and won the Fred Usher Cup for a second year in a row.

The 2019 Canada Winter Games are coming up in February, we have been working hard, putting on qualifying events for the athletes to submit qualifying scores, to earn a spot on the Team. We have named Duncan Crawford as our Head Coach along with Avril Hatherell as Manager. There will be a ABAM / Archery Canada Training camp for the selected Canada Games Team and Provincial team members December 14-16th with Archery Canada National Recurve Head Coach Shawn Riggs and Team Manitoba Canada Winter Games & National Development Coach Duncan Crawford.
